IMPRIMIS TO THE FIRSTE ARTICLE the Jury dothe Saye that the bondarie of the Parish of Rachdall begineth at the Coldgreave in the Towne of Butterworthe and from thence Eastward to a hyll called Dobbins and from Dobbins eastward to a little Clough called Little Meare Clough Head and from thence to the Redd Myres and from the Red Myres northwards to Midle Greave in Lynge greave and from thence to the Black gate foote and from Black gate northwards to Rowkenston and from thence to the Sykes in the Mosse Standing upon Waldinge Edge. And from thence Northwards to Cowlaughton from Cowlaughton northwards to Doveclawe from thence to Stonie edge from Stonyedge northwards to Salter rake, and from thence followinge betweene Great Swinche Head, and Little Swinche Head, to a brucke called Todmorden Water, And <sup>soe</sup> ~~spe~~ dissendinge the said water to a Closse called Steaners, and soe followinge the south east parte of Steaners to a close called Mythumber in Todmorden, and from thence to a river called Calder and soe desending the river of Calder to a Closse called Rydlie and soe followinge the south side of the Rydlie to Hollin Rake Holme and the south syde of a parte of Losen holme to Calder aforesaid, and assending the River of Calder to Beater Clough foote and from thence to Beater Clough Head and from thence to Shoreinforthe and from thence followinge a hedge or fence some tymes on thone syde <sup>the water,</sup> some tymes on <sup>the other</sup> thother, to Greave Clough and from thence to Bakupp, from Bakupp to Rockliffe lume from thence following the River to the Bryndwood, from thence to the Care Yate, from Care Yate to Cowapp

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Broocke, from Cowapp Broocke assending the same broocke to the head of the same and from thence to the height of the Mosse to Atkyn Butte , from thence to the Jumpe Holes, from thence to the west graine of Cheesden, and from thence followinge Cheesden Brooke to Cheesden Lume from thence to the White <sup>Diche</sup> Dicke in Godshaugh and so followinge the Water of Norden to the Wolfe Stone in Naden, from the Wolfe Stone followinge Naden Water to a diche in Bagslate Shore, from thence to Jowkynwell from thence followinge an old diche to the Calfe Heye in Bagslate from thence decendinge the pytte to the east syde of Nagmaigh Hill from thence to the pynfould on Bagslate and from thence followinge the brucke to the River of Rache, and soe dessending the River of Rache to Heawood and soe Assendinge Heawood to Heeden Brooke and soe ascendange Heeden Brooke to the hamlett of Hopwood, and soe followinge the hamlett of Hopwood to the hamlett of Thornehame and soe followinge the hamlett of Thornehame to Hathershawe Deane, and soe from thence followinge the Topp of Brynde edge to Knottboothe yeate, from thence following the townshipp of Crompton to the Hellpett Edge, and from Hellpett Edge followinge Ogden Edge to the ~~Gate~~ Colde Greave being first bondarie or meare.

Which said parishe of Rachdall butteth on the east syde uppon the severall parishes of Hytherffeild Yealand and Heptonstall.
